The deluge continues...

As you will recall we have had a persistent SW wind direction since June 2023, the wind day on June 24th 2024 will also be from a SW direction (it always is). Therefore, the wind direction will now continue in a SW direction until September 29th 2024. Wow, that is a stretch isn't it!!

These winds blow off the Atlantic which are warm and carry a lot of moisture, bringing rain and low cloud plus warmer temperatures too. It really has been an appalling deluge, that has made life extremely difficult for many, and in particular farmers and growers.

As you will recall from the Spring website entry, I was pretty much convinced that the Oak trees were going to burst into life before the Ash trees this year. Much to my surprise the Oaks stopped almost completely in its tracks, giving way to the Ash. "Ash before Oak, we are in for a soak". Further confirmation that the deluge is set to continue.

This data also ties in with what the moon phases are telling us for the rest of summer, and so as always, the wind phases, moon phases, and nature dove tail perfectly.

As ever the usual suspects are reporting on Summer 2024 heat waves, wildfires and droughts. There is nothing within the methodology that points towards that at all this year. Droughts are continuously a risk due to our lack of investment in new reservoirs, any droughts that do occur after record rainfall over the past 18 months won't be due to heat.

We will have a relatively wet UK summer, plenty of rain and a few fine dry spells. The best part of summer being the last few days of June and first three weeks of July when the weather will get progressively hotter each day reaching a maximum of perhaps 31c/32c. Make the most of this period as it is the best that Summer 2024 has to offer.

Is a Beasterly Easterly Brewing for Winter 2024/25? We think so...

Have you seen the volume of Spring Flowers the oaks are bearing this year? It will be a bumper crop of acorns for sure. Speaking of bumper crops, what about the conker trees!! Full to the brim. Again, cone trees are full - the cones of course providing winter seeds to the birds. All the fruits produced early blossoms and cherries are already forming on the trees in great numbers, pears, plums, apples and green gages too. Nuts of every description are forming, and the seed-bearing plants are growing fast this year. In places they are already taller than they were fully grown last year. The taller these plants become the more severe the winter. The rowan, elder, spindle, hawthorn, blackthorn, holly, and sorbus family, all have flowered and will produce masses of berries and fruits, this is nature giving 180 days' notice of harder colder times to come in October.

Squirrels are starting to build secondary drays (nests) just for acorn and food storage later. Nature is well ahead of the curve. Nature is filling the barn and the store cupboards for a hard, cold, early winter. It is worth noting the moon phases tally in with what nature is preparing for perfectly. Interestingly, this exact situation was the precursor to the 'Beast from the East' winter of 2017/18. Autumn 2024 will begin in October with extensive cold, and this cold will last well into March 2025. You heard it here first.

DESTROYING A MYTH

If one gets stung by stinging nettles, the accepted remedy is rubbing the affected area with dock leaves. Alas, this is incorrect, the correct and efficient curative is to crush the leaves of the plantain family to release the sap and apply to the affected area.

The mecidinal properties of these plants (greater plantain or ribwort plantain) are well known being an antihistamine, anteceptic, analgesic and even a mild antibiotic, the sap has emollient properties, meaning it is easily absorbed and moisturises the skin. It is also antifungal. The combination of all these properties makes these plants good for a number of skin complaints, bites, stings, rashes and for cleaning cuts. Used as a tea or simply eaten raw, plantains can also relieve the symptoms of hay fever.

STINGING NETTLES

Next time you are enjoying a walk with your family, take a closer look at the stinging nettles.




Stinging Nettle (Urtica Dioica)

Stinging nettles are a great wildlife attractor and are a favourite for caterpillars of the small tortoiseshell and peacock butterflies which use them as food plants. In addition, ladybugs (also known as ladybirds) feast on the aphids, which are often found on stinging nettles.

Stinging nettles provide shelter and habitat for the ladybugs. The dense foliage of nettles offers protection from harsh weather conditions, and the stinging hairs deter predators, therefore making stinging nettles the perfect place for ladybugs to reside and lay their eggs. The kids will love counting how many lady bugs they can find on the plants, so check it out!

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Sewage pollution



Water companies treat our Ocean as a literal sewer. Environmental Agencies and regulators have failed us, led by the example of course of our own Government leaders who are not only turning a blind eye to this disgraceful situation, but are actively pushing Ofwat to allow water companies to prioritise profits over reducing sewage pollution. Lining the pockets of the greedy CEOs, is of course far more important than us every day folk being able to eat safe ocean foods, or swim in the ocean without risk of sickness and or death, or the delicate eco system and its wildlife which they are rapidly destroying. The sheer quantity of sewage entering our waters means the UK is consistently considered 'The Dirty Man' of Europe and we are ranked last in Europe for water quality. Only a shocking 14% of our rivers warrant 'good' ecological status and none of them meet the required chemical standards.

"A damning report by a parliamentary committee labelled England's rivers as a dangerous 'chemical cocktail' of sewage, agricultural waste, and plastic".

"Water companies have paid out an eye watering £60 billion in dividends to shareholders over the last 30 years. And fat cat CEOs are often granted six figure pay packets every year. And to make things worse, the government are now allowing water companies to self-monitor their environmental performance resulting in ever increasing abuses of the system. The weak enforcement of existing regulation from consistently underfunded and under resourced environment agencies means there is no effective driver to ensure water companies change their behaviour."

Water companies continue to fail to invest in updating our old-fashioned sewage systems, and instead routinely discharge untreated sewage into our rivers and oceans. Water companies are required by law to report overspill events, but difficulties arise in recording accurate readings due to old infrastructure and inadequate sensors. Some water companies have even admitted that their


sewage storage facilities may not be compliant and are being investigated for releasing unpermitted sewage into water bodies, (Ofwat, 2022)

As David noted in May's website entry, the famed Oxford Vs Cambridge boat race held on the River Thames, London on 30th April 2024 came with a warning to all participants, do not enter or ingest the water, cover all wounds or sore patches, since the river is highly polluted. River Action, an environmental body has measured this water and found that per 100ml water it contains 2689 units of e-coli. The maximum safe limit for inland waters according to the Environment Agency is 1000 units. E-coli causes multiple diseases and can even cause death.

Water Companies won't invest in new systems due to the money allocated by central government being spent on ridiculous salaries, bonuses and dividends rather than the required maintenance and construction. Given the total failure of environmental agencies and regulators the inept mismanagement of water companies continues without consequence. They have failed completely in their primary duty to its customers, and seem to now expect we the taxpayer/ customer to stump up £96 million to subsidise this nightmare.

How can we accept that any of this is good enough? How can we accept that our politicians will continuously care more about the profits than wildlife or indeed human life itself. Surfers Against Sewage are doing an incredible job of raising awareness, but we need to do more.

We can make the lives of water companies as difficult as possible. For example, currently people are attempting to sue water companies when they are unable to swim in the ocean during their holidays etc. This will involve checking the Surfers Against Sewage website or app for details on where the sewage has been released, and if those releases mean you can't swim at your holiday spot, then you make the decision to take the water company to the small claims court, claiming £500 for loss of amenity. Mixed results are being reported, with some winning their claims and others being fought off robustly with water companies stating that we have "no inherent right" to swim in the ocean.

If you would like to submit a claim yourself, then it should only take 5 minutes and will cost £50 which will be reimbursed if you win. If everyone in the UK starts doing this, will it make a difference? Probably not, but it might help to apply more pressure.

JULY 2023

The expert collated notes for July read as follows: "Between 30 June and 2 July there is generally a small drop in temperature. The first week in July is in any case a period of rather variable temperatures, with weather tending to be unsettled, certainly showery if not markedly wet, and usually some thunderstorms occur from time to time in most districts (which is why it invariable rains during the Wimbledon tennis tournament). From 9 to 25th July temperature levels are generally higher. The thunderstorm risk continues, though then frequency of the outbreaks decreases. However, when these storms do occur, they are heavy, and southern England can be badly affected – northern districts rather less so. Conditions generally during this middle period of July tend to be sultry and humid, with winds blowing lightly or at moderate strength for the south. From 26th July to the end of the month it is normally cooler, with rather wet and unsettled weather affecting all districts. Moderate to fresh south=-westerly winds are common and may be strong at times in the north. The period 13 -15th July is Buchan warm period often with the hottest days of the year (even though the 15th is St Swithun's day – a rainy day in folklore). The last two days of the month (30/31st) too in recent years have tended to be very hot days too."

To summarise, the first three weeks of July will be glorious. The best summer 2024 has to offer us. This period will see fine weather, and the temperature will gradually heat up day by day reaching a maximum of 31/32c. This weather will eventually break down after the third week, and we will return to cold and showery weather in the main.

FULL MOON THIS MONTH IS CALLED A FULL BUCK MOON

Fun Fact: In many Countries July is known for being National Ice Cream Month. It was officially designated as such in the United States by President Ronald Reagan in 1984. So, July is the perfect time to indulge in your favourite frozen treats and celebrate the deliciousness of ice cream!

Nature Gnomes: Rock Pooling is the perfect activity for July, particularly during those first three warm weeks! A dry, calm day makes it all the easier to spot all the lovely creatures in the rock pools. Bring a bucket, a pencil and a notebook and see what you can find! Make sure you write down or draw everything you find along the way. You will then have the beginnings of your very own 'Sightings' document which is exactly what David and I use after our daily walks. You might find crabs, shells, fossils, mussels, seaweed, star fish or shrimp! Let me know what you find!

AUGUST 2024

The expert collated notes for the month of August read as follows: "The unsettled weather of late July normally continues into the first few days of August, so that the first few days of August tend to be appreciably cooler than mid-July. After this the weather becomes more settled and warmer during most years, and the period 8th -14th August is one of high average sunshine, particularly in the southeast of England. Averages over long periods show that the highest temperatures in Britain occur on 12th-14th August [Ed note - this is also a Buchan warm period]. After that the temperatures generally begin to fall, and the latter half of the month is often rather cool despite a three-day warmer period that may occur in the third or fourth weeks. The most thundery part of the month is the 19th – 25th. At first thunderstorms tend to break out in the southern districts and then move northwards to affect northern England and southern Scotland around 23 -25th August. In some years there is a further thundery period around 28th -29th August, but the last two days of the month are generally quite settled and quite often very warm. [Ed note - this very warm end to the month has been a feature in recent years]" This August, with good fortune, will be real summer from mid-July until about the 8th, therefore make the best of it, since, as can be seen from the attached weather sheet, it is downhill, with the rest of the month predominantly wet. There could be a dry warmer spell around the 13th to the 15th, if this occurs then it may well trigger thunderstorms, such is the UK summer period.

To summarise the first two weeks of August are likely to be very wet indeed. From 19th to 21st August, we have a dangerous combination of the Full Moon/ Blue Moon, Highest Spring Tides and Perigee. A natural disaster of some kind is likely to take place somewhere in the world around this time. We will have a fairer interlude of weather around August 19th and the month will likely end with a mix of rain showers and sunshine.

FULL MOON THIS MONTH IS CALLED STURGEON MOON/ CORN MOON.

Fun Weatherlore: The Germans have an apt saying for the month of August. "What is not cooked in August is spoilt in September". I am unclear if this is monitory or prophetic – what do you think?

Nature Gnomes: The tomato plants you planted earlier this year will have produced lots of delicious tomatoes by now. These plants will soon be coming to an end for the year, but there is a way to ensure they make a magical reappearance next year, with a little help from you and a magical Nature Gnome spell.

Firstly, go and pick 2 or 3 of the ripest, juiciest tomatoes you can see. Cut open the tomatoes (our littlest Nature Gnomes will need to ask for help with this), and then scoop or squeeze out all the pulp onto a plate. There will be around 100 seeds in each tomato, you can try and count if you like! Once you have squeezed the pulp out, put the pulp in an empty jam jar or similar container. Top up the mixture with a little water too and cover the top of the jar with a paper towel or coffee filter. Use an elastic band to secure the paper towel/ coffee filter in place. Now close your eyes, hold the jar and swirl around the pulp mixture gently whilst saying, "Tomatoes, tomatoes, thank you for all the Vitamin C. We had all the fun, so next year will you come back to see me?" Now leave them in a cool dry place for 5 days away from sunlight. Every day close your eyes and swirl round the pulp saying the same magic spell. You only need to do this once a day, it is very important to let the magic pulp rest the rest of the time.

At the end of the 5th day, tip the magic mixture into a strainer and you will see little tomato seeds. Give them a really good rinse under the tap and then tip the seeds onto a clean paper towel. Now transfer the seeds to a non-stick surface like a plate or chopping board. Leave the seeds in a warm dry place out of sunlight for two weeks to dry out. Once dried out, pop in a paper bag or envelope and next year you can plant these seeds and hey presto, that super amazing tomato plant you loved so very much will be back for another summer with you. Have fun Nature Gnomes.

SEPTEMBER 2024

The expert collated notes for September read as follows: "September often opens with another period of dry fine benign weather, and between the end of August and 7th September average barometric pressure rises quite distinctly in most parts of the country. Sometimes predominantly dry weather lasts until around the 18th of September. But 17th to 25th September, which includes the period of the autumn equinox, is generally stormy, the peak being the 20th. Winds during this period tend to blow from the north-west and bring sharp falls of temperature, possibly leading to an early frost bin sheltered areas protected from the prevailing winds. The last part of summer nis known as 'old wives summer,' when nearly every country in Europe recognizes the likelihood of a period of dry fine and warm weather. It is not as common in Britain as on the continent. The 29th, Michaelmass, is the quarter day that sets the predominant wind direction up until 21st December (St Thomas') the next such wind day."

To summarise: September will cool down quite rapidly. We will have a mix of cooler temperatures, showers and sunshine. The weather will likely be windy at times too. Alas we have another dangerous weather combination to contend with from between $17^{th} - 21^{st}$ September. Therefore, the chance of a natural disaster somewhere in the world is raised by 100%. We will have a fine spell of weather to end the month with around 24^{th} where temperatures should temporarily recover. Make the most of this final stretch of pleasant weather, as the cold comes in thick and fast in October and will be with us well into March!

FULL MOON ON THE 29th IS CALLED FULL HARVEST MOON

Weatherlore Fun: I find the below to be very true indeed, and fun to look out for in September.

"Summer goes with the swallows". Very true, whether they fly away early or late.

"When summer meets winter it's a good augury for the coming Spring".
